## A competitive “High School Curriculum” Atlanta Science Academy

-28+ Credits (Georgia requires 23 credits)

-8 AP courses, 14 dual enrollment courses, 10 honor courses

-100 volunteer hours

-CRMP (College Readiness and Mentorship Program)

-SAT prep courses

-PSAT offered every year two times for 8<sup>th</sup> and 9<sup>th</sup> grade students and one time for 10<sup>th</sup> grade to track the progress.

\*For the first time (2016-2017) we have offered PSAT and AP Human Geography testing to our 8th-10th graders. Some of the students who took the PSAT are ranked as 98th, 95th, 94th and, 92nd percentiles.

63% of test takers passed the AP Human Geography. This rate is way higher than national average and many local agencies.
